

Is there a God?

There is in human existence no more profound question demanding an answer. Is there a God? This is the question that must be answered by every human being, and the answer is far-reaching in its implications for every individual. Does God exist? This is one of the most important questions a person can consider. Your belief or disbelief in the existence of God has enormous implications on your view of life, humanity, morality, and destiny.

Let's spell out the practical implications: The whole tenor of human life is affected by whether people regard themselves as supreme beings in the universe or acknowledge a super human being whom they conceive of as an object of fear or love, a force to be defied or a Lord to be obeyed.

God in a test tube

We must be clear from the outset that it is not possible to put God in a test tube or prove him by the usual scientific methodology. It can be said with equal emphasis that it is not possible to prove Napoleon by the scientific method. The reason lies in the nature of history itself, and in the limitations of the scientific method. In order for something to be proved by the scientific method, it must be repeated. One cannot announce a new finding to the world on the basis of a single experiment. History in its very nature can not be duplicated. No one can rerun the beginning of the universe or bring Napoleon back or repeat the assassination of Lincoln or the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. The fact that these events can't be proved by repetition does not disprove their reality as events.

To insist that God be proven by the scientific method is like insisting that a telephone be used to measure radioactivity.

Infinite time plus chance

No one would think a computer could come into being without an intelligent designer. It is unlikely that a monkey in a print shop could set Lincoln's Gettysburg address in type. If we found a copy of it, we would conclude that an intelligent mind was the only possible explanation for the printing. How much more incredible is it to believe that the universe, in its infinite complexity, could have happened by chance? The human body, for instance, is an admittedly astounding and complex organism, a continual marvel of organization, design and efficiency. So impressed was Albert Einstein with this that he said, *"My religion consists of a humble admiration of the illuminant superior Spirit who reveals himself in the slight details we are able to perceive with our frail and feeble minds. That deeply emotional conviction of the presence of a superior reasoning power, which is revealed in the incomprehensible universe, forms my idea of God."*

There are basically two choices for believers and nonbelievers alike: Did the universe begin by chance or by purpose and design? Scientists have long relied on infinite time plus chance to explain the origin of the universe and thus for them avoid the unacceptable conclusion of divine cause. They projected that given an ideally prepared primordial soup, jolted by frequent electrical charges and an unlimited period of time, some life form would evolve. However, the difficulties this theory presents are so enormous that today those same scientists are pointing out its weakness. The distinguished astronomer Sir Fred Hoyle has proposed an analogy to illustrate these difficulties. He asks, *"How long would it take a blindfolded person to solve a Rubik's Cube."* If he made one move per second, without resting, he estimates it would take an astonishing 1.35 trillion years! Therefore, he concludes, when you consider the life expectancy of a human being, a blindfolded person could not solve the Rubik's Cube.

Hoyle then explains that it would be equally as difficult for the accidental formation of only one of the many chains of amino acids in a living cell. In every human cell there are about 200,000 such amino acids. Now, if you would compute the time required to get all 200,000 amino acids for one human cell to come together by chance, it would be about 293.5 times the estimated age of the earth (set at the standard 4.6 billion years). The odds against this happening would be infinitesimally small, far greater than a blindfolded person trying to solve the Rubik's Cube!

In his impressive book *The Intelligent Universe*, Hoyle concludes, "*As biochemists discover more and more about the awesome complexity of life, it is apparent that its chances of originating by accident are so minute that they can be completely ruled out. Life cannot have arisen by chance.*"

Order and design in the universe

The physical systems of our universe loudly proclaim that someone programmed instructions into the individual parts to produce the world we see. Dr. Robert Gange suggests it would be valid to say that it was intentionally designed. If someone should claim that living structures can be traced to the physical properties of subnuclear particles, we still need to ask, "*How did they arise?*" Why, for example, does an electron have exactly the electrical charge and mass that it does? Why is it that light travels at precisely the speed it does? And who or what dialed the value of the gravitational "constant"?

From the myriad examples we could cite of intentional design, consider the remarkable properties of plain water. Dr. L. J. Henderson enumerates some of these properties:

Water has a high specific heat. This means that chemical reactions within the (human) body will be kept rather stable. If water had a

low specific heat we would "boil over" with the least activity. If we raise the temperature of a solution by 10°C we speed up the reaction by two. Without this particular property of water, life would hardly be possible. The ocean is the world's thermostat. It takes a large loss of heat for water to pass from liquid to ice, and for water to become steam quite an intake of energy is required. Hence the ocean is a cushion against the heat of the sun and the freezing blast of the winter. Unless the temperatures of the earth's surface were modulated by the ocean and kept within certain limits, life would either be cooked to death or frozen to death.

Water is the universal solvent. It dissolves acids, bases, and salts. Chemically it is relevantly inert, providing a medium for reactions without partaking in them. In the bloodstream it holds in solution the minimum of 64 substances; any other solvent would be a pure sludge. Without the particular properties of water, life as we know it would be impossible.

The earth itself is evidence of design. If it were much smaller an atmosphere would be impossible (as on Mercury and the moon). If it was much larger the atmosphere would contain free hydrogen (as on Jupiter and Saturn). Its distance from the sun is correct – even a small change would make it too hot or too cold to sustain human life. Our moon, probably responsible for the continents and ocean basins, is unique in our solar system and seems to have originated in a way quite different from the other relatively much smaller moons. The tilt of the (earth's) axis insures the seasons, and so on.

From the temperatures to the tides, to plain water and myriad other characteristics that we so easily take for granted; the earth is an unparalleled planetary masterpiece. Like Handel's Messiah or da Vinci's Last Supper, it should never be carelessly pawned off as the result of blind evolutionary process that rests on the logically absurd

notion that the universe created itself. That something comes from nothing and that affects have no original cause!

Dr. Louis Bounoure, former director of research at the French National Center for Scientific Research, calls evolution "*a fairy tale for grown-ups.*" One can call it a cruel hoax! In fact, the arguments that support evolutionary theory are astonishingly weak.

You need to know that the fossil record is an embarrassment to evolutionists. No variable transitions from one kind to another have yet been found. Charles Darwin had an excuse; in his day fossil finds were relatively scarce. Today, however, we have an abundance of fossils. With all the millions of fossils that have been found, some 60 million specimens in the British Museum of History alone: "Why is there not one single fossil find that indicates verifiable transition from one species to another?" And yet, 120 years after Darwin, it is common knowledge among paleontologists that transitions from one species to another do not exist. Darwin's evolutionary theory has been proven wrong.

Further more, amazing examples of design can be seen within living things, including humans. There are approximately 11,000,000 species of life on earth and each one is a living miracle. They are the result of mind-boggling organizational intricacies at the molecular level that leaves us in awe. Consider the human eye. Consider the fitting together efficiently and cooperatively of the lenses, retina and brain; enabling humans to have vision; as conclusive evidence of the design of an all-wise Creator. Thus the functional design of organisms and their features are taken as evidence of the existence of the designer.

Even Darwin himself in a chapter titled "Difficulties with the Theory" from his *Origins of Species* states, "*To suppose that the eye, with so many parts all working together..... could have been formed*

by natural selection, seems, I freely confess, absurd in the highest degree." Harvard's Richard Lewontin, an evolutionist, states that organisms "*appear to have been carefully and artfully designed*" and calls the perfection of organisms "*the chief evidence of a Supreme Designer.*"

The universe had a beginning

In addition to design in the universe, there is the implication that the universe had in a sense a beginning – a moment in time that brought the world into being. The Bible describes it this way: "*In the beginning You (Lord) laid the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the work of Your hands (Psalms 102:25).*"

Scientists avoided the idea that time had a beginning or an end since it suggested divine intervention. Throughout the years a number of alternative theories were developed. One attempt was the "continuous creation/steady-state" model of the universe. In this model it was proposed that as the galaxies move further away from each other, new galaxies were formed in between, out of matter that was being 'continually created.' The conclusion from this and other factors is that the universe had no beginning and is eternal.

Dr. Robert Jastrow, founder of NASA's Institute for Space Studies, explains that the opposite is true. The moment a star is born it begins to consume some of the hydrogen in the universe, and there is continual dilution of both hydrogen and heavier metals in the universe today. He concludes that the theory of an eternal universe is untenable.

A second theory proposed by scientists for the beginning of the universe has been called the "oscillating model." This says that the universe is like a spring, expanding and contracting, repeating the cycle indefinitely. The basis for this theory is that the universe is "closed," that is, no new energy is being put into it. The expansion of

matter would reach a certain point and the force of gravity pull everything together before expanding again. However, all the evidence refutes this position; the universe is clearly losing density with no sign that the persistent extension ever has or ever will reverse, and thus is not closed.

Dr. William L Craig gives his conclusion about these two models: *"Both the steady-state and oscillating models of the universe fail to fit the facts of observational cosmology. Therefore we can conclude once more that the universe began to exist."*

A third view of the beginning of the universe became known as the Big Bang theory. Scientists who observed this phenomenon theorized that the universe must have originally resembled a white hot fireball in the very first moments after the Big Bang occurred. A confirmation of this theory came in 1965 when two physicists discovered that the earth was entirely bathed in a faint glow of radiation. Its waves followed the exact pattern of wavelength expected in a giant explosion. Scientists declared there could be no other obvious explanation than they were the aftermath of the Big Bang.

Dr. Robert Jastrow, who states that he is an agnostic in religious matters, comments on the theory of the Big Bang:

"Now we see how the astronomical evidence leads to a biblical view of the origin of the world. The details differ, but the essential elements in the astronomical and biblical accounts of Genesis are the same. The chain of events leading to man commenced suddenly and sharply at a definite moment in time, in a flash of light and energy."

Of course, as I mentioned earlier, the previous two alternative theories have been crafted over the years to try to avoid this absolute

beginning, but none of these theories has commended itself to the scientific community as more plausible than the Big Bang theory.

Scientists cannot bear the thought of natural phenomenon which cannot be explained, even with unlimited time and money. There is a kind of religion in science; every event can be explained in a rational way as the product of some previous event; every effect must have its cause. Now that science has proven that the universe exploded into being at a certain moment; it asks, "*What cause produced this effect? Who or what put the matter and energy into the universe?*" And science cannot answer these questions! With the proof now in place, cosmologists can no longer hide behind the possibility of a past-eternal universe. There is no escape, they have to face the problem of a cosmic beginning.

The problem was nicely captured by Anthony Kenny of Oxford University. He writes, "*A proponent of the Big Bang theory, at least if he is an atheist, must believe that the universe came from nothing and by nothing.*" But surely that doesn't make sense! Out of nothing, nothing comes. So why does the universe exist instead of just nothing? Where did it come from? There must have been a cause which brought the universe into being.

For the scientist who is living by his faith in the power of reason, the story ends like a bad dream. He has scaled the mountains of ignorance; he is about to conquer the highest peak; as he pulls himself over the final rock, he is greeted by a band of theologians who have been sitting there for centuries. One of those theologians was the Psalmist King David who in the Book of Psalms said knowingly, "*The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands (Psalms 19:1).*" And the apostle Paul wrote, "*God has made it plain..... For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature*

– have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse (Romans 1:19-20)."

Isn't it incredible that the Big Bang theory thus confirms what the Christian theist has always believed: that in the beginning God created the universe? Now I put it to you: which makes more sense: that the Christian theist is right or that the universe popped into being uncaused out of nothing? I, at least, have no trouble assessing these alternatives!

If we pursue this thought and take this a step further, the Big Bang theory only yields matter and energy. It doesn't even begin to address the origin of life. So how do we get life from nonlife? The thought that something can come from nothing is absurd. Where is the evidence? Well, you're going to need another something-from-nothing leap of faith, some kind of biological, second Big Bang. For all the mind-blowing advancements we've made in physics, biology, and chemistry in just the past hundred years, we're still no closer to making it happen. We don't have a clue. The closer we look, the wider the chasm.

I mean, sure, we've learned a lot about how to manipulate life forms, how to add and subtract DNA material, even map the human genome, but we have no idea how to literally create life from dead stuff. One needs only to look carefully at any living creature to gain some concept of their enormous complexity. For instance, if you have a pet, consider the complexities that must be involved enabling that "package of matter" to move around, play, remember, show signs of affection, eat and reproduce.

Yet, even with all of modern man's accumulated scientific and technological knowledge, advanced tools, and experience today, we still could not construct a similar living pet from carbon, calcium, hydrogen, oxygen, etc. – the pet's basic constituent parts. Yet, all the

chemical information needed to construct your pet or any other animal is contained in a tiny speck (the fertilized egg cell). Doesn't that just boggle your mind, that somehow evolution can do this (create something from nothing) while we with all our modern advancements we've made in physics, biology, chemistry, cannot. This just shows you the myth of evolution. That dead chemicals somehow produced the first living things out of nothing. This is why I call evolution a religion! Because it would take a lot more faith to believe in evolution which says that from nothing we get everything than it would to believe in God's creation. Evolution is not science; it's science fiction.

Let's dwell a bit further in regards to the complexity of all living creatures. Even the simplest organism capable of independent life, the prokaryotic bacteria cell, is a masterpiece of miniaturized complexity which makes a spaceship seem rather low-tech.

However, none surpasses the overall complexity of the human being. Not only is each person constructed of trillions of molecules and cells, the human brain alone is filled with billions of cells forming trillions and trillions of connections. The design of the human brain is truly awesome and beyond our understanding. Every cubic inch of the human brain contains at least 100 million nerve cells interconnected by more than 10,000 miles of fibers.

It is said that man's three pound brain is the most complex and orderly arrangement of matter in the entire universe. Far more complicated than any computer, the human brain is capable of storing and creatively manipulating seemingly infinite amounts of information. Its capabilities and potential stagger the imagination. Yet, none of it could be possible without a Designer or Creator.

How can evolutionists claim that all living things evolved into existence, when even science has yet to discover how even one

protein molecule could actually have come into existence by natural processes. Further, there is substantial evidence that spontaneous generation is impossible. Only DNA is known to produce DNA. No chemical interaction of molecules has even come close to producing this ultra-complex code which is so essential to all known life.

Science gives us ample reason to believe in God. The DNA in our cells is very similar to an intricate computer program. The order in which they are arranged instructs the cell's action. What is amazing is that within the tiny space in every cell in your body, this code is three billion letters long. To grasp the amount of DNA information in one cell, a live reading of that code at a rate of three letters per second would take a person 31 years to read it out, and that includes reading it day and night. But wait there's more! It has been determined that 99.9% of your DNA is similar to everyone's genetic makeup. What is uniquely you comes in the fractional difference in how those 3 billion letters are sequenced in your cells. Inside every cell in you is a three billion lettered DNA structure that belongs only to you. This code identifies you and continually instructs your cell's behavior by informing and directing the cell's process.

How can one explain this sophisticated coding that resides in our cells? On June 26, 2000, President Clinton congratulated those who completed the human genome sequencing. President Clinton said, *"Today we are learning the language in which God created life. We are gaining even more awe for the complexity, the beauty, the wonder of God's most divine and sacred gift."* Dr. Francis Collins, director of the Human Genome Project, followed Clinton to the podium stating, *"It is humbling for me and awe-inspiring to realize that we have caught the first glimpse of our own instruction book, previously known only to God."*

When looking at the DNA structure within the human body, we cannot escape the presence of intelligent design. Just as God has

engineered DNA to instruct the cell, He has offered to instruct us, to make our lives function well when He inspired human writers to write down exactly what He wanted to communicate to us in His instruction manual for us called "The Bible."

The key to the entire Bible hangs right by the front door: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth (Genesis 1:1)." The Bible writers never tried to explain God's existence and neither should you. There are no scientific proofs for God by our limited human minds. Don't let that shock you. God doesn't need any proof. The existence of God cannot be proved or disproved by science because God isn't physical but God is Spirit. God is not confined to any one place at any time. He is an invisible Person who is present in all places at one and the same time, who is all-knowing, and who is all-powerful. Therefore, *"those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth (John 4:24)."* The Bible says that we must accept by faith the fact that God exists: *"And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him (Hebrews 11:6)."* Sometimes an atheist will come up to a believer and say, *"Prove there is a God."* That should never threaten any believer; just smile and say, *"Prove there is no God."*

You see, God does not reside in the realm of proof. To try to prove God by looking through physical, material things would be like tearing apart a piano trying to find the "Hallelujah Chorus." You don't prove God, and you don't disprove God. You believe in God. And if a man doesn't believe in God, it's because he has chosen not to believe in God and wants to live his life separated from God and no amount of evidence will change his mind.

Be honest with yourself. Will any amount of evidence convince you? Probably not! Why? Because the problem is not an intellectual or evidential one! Enough evidence exists for anyone to make an

intelligent decision, but no amount of evidence will change someone's mind to believe against their will or if they want to live their life differently or separately from God. That is reality! That is also the problem! Look at all the evidence that's exists against smoking. Has that convinced all smokers to quit? No! The desire to act has to come from your heart.

People claim to reject God's existence because it is "not scientific" or "because there is no proof." The true reason is that once they admit that there is a God, they also must realize that they are responsible to God and in need of forgiveness from Him (Romans 3:23, 6:23). If God exists, then we are accountable to Him for our actions. If God does not exist, then we can do whatever we want without having to worry about God judging us. That is why many of those who deny the existence of God cling to the theory of naturalistic evolution – it gives them an alternative to believing in a Creator God.

I do not understand how anyone who claims to operate from reason could conclude that life evolved. How life can begin from nothing. How non-life produced everything that we see on earth. To me it makes as much sense as when Diane and I went to South Dakota and with both of us standing in front of Mount Rushmore, looking at the president's faces and me saying to her, "Wow Diane, take a look at this, isn't it amazing what can be created accidentally from erosion."

Has God revealed Himself to mankind?

Now, to answer your question "Is there a God?" Yes there is. He is specifically revealed to us in the Bible, and more specifically in the person of Jesus Christ. If you want to encounter the true and living God, you'll find Him revealed in the Bible; God's instruction manual for us. The Bible is all about Jesus. He is God in the flesh. Read the gospels that speak of Jesus. In the very first chapter of the New Testament it tells us, "*Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear*

a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated "God with us."

Yes, the God of the Bible is Immanuel; God with us. God revealing Himself to humanity; becoming one of us. Literally; God walking around in the body and Person of Jesus Christ and showing us the nature and character of God the Father! Just imagine, we have a loving God who has condescended to come and live in the midst of our suffering and pain and to help us face it and conquer it. The hand that touched the leper had dirt under its nails and the tears He wept came from a heart as broken as yours or mine will ever be. What a wonder! It is the truth that we will probably never really comprehend fully with our finite minds.

To think that Jesus left the splendor and glory of heaven to come down to earth to lay down His own life for us; to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins and to offer us hope, salvation, reconciliation, and life eternal. Jesus came into the world to be the Savior of lost mankind. I'd love for you to understand that this unique Person is the only hope of lost mankind.

Our problem is not so much that we are sinners and in need of forgiveness although that's there but our deeper problem is that we're spiritually dead and in need of life. The biblical fact is that natural man is born physically alive into this world but is spiritually dead and separated from the **life** of God. It is the result of what happened in the garden of Eden when Adam and Eve were deceived by Satan into disobeying God. God created Adam and Eve fully alive spiritually (body, soul, and spirit). They had a relationship with God, the Father. There was nothing that stood between them and God until they were deceived by Satan into disobeying God. At that moment when they committed the sin of disobedience God's Spirit left Adam and Eve and spiritual death entered their lives and throughout the ages has impacted all of humanity – alive bodily, but born spiritually

dead and separated from God. It seems so stark, so dismal, so final and there is not a lot of hope in that reality until we realize what Christ came to accomplish.

After the fall of Adam and Eve it's been God's plan all along to bring mankind back to Himself, to restore that relationship He once had with Adam. Salvation is going from death to life. Going from being spiritually dead to becoming spiritually alive. All of us come into this world experiencing that same problem – being born spiritually death, and so God sent Christ Jesus into the world to correct that problem. In John 11:25-26, Jesus said, *"I am the resurrection and the **life**. He who believes in Me will live (eternally) even though he dies (physically). And whoever lives and believes in Me will never die (spiritually)."* The thought here is that we must believe that God sent the Lord Jesus to be our Savior. You must believe what God says about the Lord Jesus, namely, that He is the only Savior and that sins can only be put away through His work on Calvary's cross and that He came to give us spiritual life. When we believe in Jesus and receive Him as our Lord and Savior, we cross over from death to **life**.

When we come to Christ by faith, He sends the Holy Spirit to take up residence in us and in our lives. At that moment we're fully alive spiritually. With God's Spirit living in us we're exactly what God had intended us to be; just as it was in the beginning when He created Adam – restoring man back to his true humanity. That's a radical change. The spirit within us that was dead to God has now been made alive. Now we are connected to God through Christ Jesus. It's such a radical transformation of God that He gives us a new identity. He calls us new creatures in Christ or "Children of God." (John 1:12)

Getting back to the deity of Jesus, it is an undeniable truth from the Bible. The first chapter in the book of John nails down Christ's divinity. John begins his Gospel by speaking about *the Word* – but he

does not explain at first who or what the Word is. A word is a unit of speech by which we express ourselves to others. But John is not writing about *speech* but rather about a *Person*. That Person is the Lord Jesus Christ. God has fully expressed Himself to mankind in the Person of the Lord Jesus. By coming into the world, Christ has perfectly revealed to us what God is like. By dying for us on the cross, He has told us how much God loves us. Thus Christ is God's living Word to man, the expression of God's thoughts.

The Bible teaches that there is one God and that there are three Persons in the Godhead – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. All three of these Persons are God. In the very first verse of John, two of the Persons of the Godhead are mentioned – God the Father and God the Son. It is the first of many clear statements in this Gospel stating that Jesus Christ is God. In verse 3 it says that "*All things were made through Him.*" He Himself was not a created being; rather He was the creator of *all things*. This includes mankind, the animals, the plants, the angels – *all things* visible and invisible. "*Without Him nothing was made that was made.*" All three Persons of the Godhead were involved in the work of creation: "*God created the heavens and the earth*" (Genesis 1:1). "*The Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters*" (Genesis 1:2). "*All things were created through Him (Christ) and for Him*" (Colossians 1:16b).

Your response to this question "**Is there a God?**" will go towards determining your final destination, which will be in one of two places after your physical demise. Either being with a loving God who created you and having an everlasting relationship with Him for all eternity or rejecting Him and being separated from God for all eternity in a place reserved for Satan and his followers where they consciously "*Will be tormented day and night forever and ever*" (Revelation 20:10)."

Contrary to what some may believe, the Bible never teaches that the unsaved dead will be annihilated. *"The smoke of their torment ascends perpetually and there is no relief day or night (Rv14:11).* Just think of the utter loneliness being separated from God and from all other people and being punished day and night – never ending. All people who have preferred to be independent of God, walking in their own ways neglecting His free gift of salvation, will thus eternally be granted that freedom from God which they so desire, in a place reserved for Satan and his followers. God doesn't force anyone to love Him. The plain truth is: God doesn't need us! God has all the angels in heaven to look after and administer to all of His needs. Scripture clearly tells us that God's purpose in creating you and I was for His pleasure, for His fellowship, so that we can have a special father-child relationship with Him – it's called love.

The Bible tells us of how God who is beyond our universe entered His own creation in order to demonstrate His love for us in the most dramatic and personal way possible, *"Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends (John 15:13)."* God loves you so much that He wants you to know Him and spend eternity with Him. That's why He created you. That's why He sent His only begotten Son, Christ Jesus, to earth to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins and in the process reconciling man back to Himself, so that each one of us could know and understand God in a personal way. The only way to have a personal relationship with God is to receive Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. Jesus said, *"I am the way, I am the truth, and I am the **life** and no one comes to the Father except through Me (John 14:6)."* Your future and eternity hinge on how you respond to Christ. As Jesus declared, *"If you don't believe that I am the One I claim to be, you will indeed die in your sins (John 8:24)."*

You can rationalize this all you want but that is the reality you face according to Scripture. Choose wisely – either accepting or rejecting Christ Jesus! As to what will be your eternal and final destination – the choice is yours to make while you're still alive.

In closing, remember.....

God made the first move.... He created man for His pleasure and to have fellowship with Him.
